Therefore, we ask that only those who are instructed in the Lutheran Confessions and are under our pastor's spiritual care come forward to receive the Lord's Supper.

If you are visiting us and wish to receive the Lord's Supper, please speak to the pastor *before* the service. Everyone is welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.

Our teaching on this matter is explained in more detail in the little leaflet, 'Why Closed Communion?', which is available from the pastor.



A Reading From The Book Of Concord

THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION ARTICLES IV & V

Article V: The Ministry.

That we may obtain this faith, the ministry of teaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments was instituted. Through the Word and Sacraments, as through instruments, the Holy Spirit is given. He works faith, when and where it pleases God, in those who hear the Gospel, namely that God justifies those who believe that they are received into grace for Christ's sake. This happens not through our own merits, but for Christ's sake.
